### II. 12:40-12:45 p.m. – Voting Items – Don Tracy

- a. September 2021 Minutes
  - A motion to approve the September 2021 Minutes was made by David Clauss and seconded by Charles Moody. The motion was approved unanimously by voice vote.

a. Donald Tracy shared his reflections from the Reentry Services Landscape report. Only a quarter of respondents had formalized relationships with criminal justice institutions. Donald spoke about these relationships and how they improve his programs at ACC. Don spoke about other gaps he noticed in reentry services: gaps of ESL programs, gaps of spiritual support, gaps in clothing support. - a. Kelly gave an overview of FY22 Deliverables. Then, Planning Council and guests choose a breakout room to discuss either Deliverable #1 Community of Practice model or Deliverable #2 Reentry & Diversion Center.
- b. Corwin shared from the Deliverable #2 group. He loved to see a lot of care around this issue, and a growing capacity with partnerships. Corwin spoke about using a racial equity lens and toolset and learn the landscape before implementation. This will help understand the potential for unintended consequences. Hopeful for the direction we are heading and the care of the Roundtable community.
- c. Madeleine shared about the conversation in the Deliverable #1 group. The Community of Practice is a needed network to encourage communication between reentry service providers. The group spoke about the principles of building trust and a reputation for real outcomes. Need to be an effective tool and strong network before we can build trust in the community.
